### What to know ...

Basic <u>pathways to employment</u> can involve several choices. The most common first choice is to complete <u>High School or it's</u> <u>equivalence</u>. This single choice opens many pathways that maybe closed off to those that did not gain a diploma. Pathway 1. <u>Workforce Training Certificate</u> Pathway 2. <u>Community College</u> Degree or Certificate Pathway 3. <u>University Degree</u> Pathway 4. <u>Organized Labor Training/Apprenticeship Certificate</u> Pathway 5. <u>Military</u> However, there are a <u>variety of potentially easy and high-quality</u> jobs out there that <u>don't require a high school diploma or GED</u>. These jobs can range from <u>customer service</u> to <u>construction</u>, as well as <u>entry-level</u> roles that can lead to <u>high-paying</u> positions with experience.

The <u>career pathway</u> you decide you want to take will lead you on a journey. <u>This journey is in perpetual motion</u> with feedback to every new level you decide to take. In essence, you start by <u>discovery yourself</u> and <u>making a portfolio of who you are</u>. Then comes the <u>career exploration</u> and <u>where to go next</u>. After which you need to <u>develop your skills</u> filling in those needs that your <u>career choice</u> requires, and finally <u>persueing your goals</u> with descriptions of how you got there. Remember, this is a loop, as you discover your goals a person <u>generally evaluates</u> on where they started and where they've gone; you start again to discover more about yourself and so on.
